A. PAYROLL **DISBURSEMENT OF** JANUARY 15, 2021

# **RESOLVED (No. 15237),** that the Board approved:

- The payroll for the period ending January 15, 2021 amounting to gross pay of \$85,028.12 (composed of the following withholdings and deductions) Federal Income Tax - \$6,962.26; FICA- \$6,363.74; State Tax - \$3,439.70; KPERS - \$5,060.80, Insurance - 2,571.05; United Way - \$142.50; Eq-flex - \$1,473.29; PEDC - \$2,947.50; Misc - \$20.00, Optional Group Life \$11.20 and Deposits \$56,036.08 including the following overtime amounts: Distribution 21 hours @ \$854.99, North Plant 57 hours @ \$1,959.88 and South Plant 77 hours @ \$2,48567 be approved and disbursements made from the Revenue Fund for their respective amounts.
- **B. PAYMENT OF CLAIMS**
- The Regular Claims \$365,016.54, Special Claims \$2,439.70 and Special/Special as follows: AT&T Mobility \$987.24, Capital One \$261.83, Home Depot \$741.35, Tractor Supply \$143.20, Evergy \$35,939.29 and KS Gas \$2,639.99 checks be drawn on the Revenue Fund for their respective amounts.

CONSIDERATION OF CHANGE ORDER 2 WITH WESTLAND CONSTRUCTION, INC FOR GIRARD WATERLINE PROJECT Westland Construction submitted Change Order number 2 for the Girard waterline project. The changes are summarized as:

- Delete tapping sleeve and valve (-\$3,450.50)
- Redo tie in at Quincy and Franklin due to leaking valve and lead tee (\$5,252)
- Redo connection at Kansas and 10<sup>th</sup> Ave due to sewer/conflicts (\$6,425)
- Additional fittings (\$15,166)
- Additional pavement (\$33,750)

Even with the changes, the final contract price is lower than next bid.

Upon motion from Director Norris, seconded by Director Savage, motion passed 4-0.

**RESOLVED (No. 15238),** that the Board authorize the General Manager to execute Change Order No. 2 for an additional \$57,142.50, for final contract price of \$743,669.00.

CONSIDERATION OF FINAL PAYMENT FOR GIRARD WATERLINE PROJECT

Westland Construction has completed the Girard Waterline project. Staff recommends releasing the final payment to close out the project. Upon motion from Director Norris, seconded by Director Lough, motion passed 4-0.

**RESOLVED (No. 15239),** that the Board authorize the release of final payment to Westland Construction.

CONSIDERATION OF CHANGE ORDER 1 FOR WESTERN WATERLINE PROJECT Due to the Covid 19 pandemic, Engemann Drainage requested 14 additional days of contract time.

Upon motion from Director Savage, seconded by Director Lough, motion passed 4-0.

**RESOLVED (No. 15240),** that the Board authorize the General Manager to execute Change Order 1 for an additional 14 calendar days, to extend the contract by two weeks to December 13<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

CONSIDERATION OF FINAL PAYMENT FOR WESTERN WATERLINE PROJECT

Engemann Drainage has completed the Western and Misc Waterline project. Staff recommends releasing the final payment to close out the project.

Upon motion from Director Norris, seconded by Director Lough, motion passed 4-0.

**RESOLVED (No. 15241),** that the Board authorize the release of final payment to Engemann Drainage.

# PRESENTATION OF BOP TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION PERMIT FOR TANK PROJECT

January 5<sup>th</sup>, we received the temporary permit from the Federal Bureau of Prisons for the water tank project. It will allow us to proceed with project, pending the actual property easement from the U.S. Department of Justice. With this permit, we can proceed, at our own cost, to complete the site clearing prior to a March 31st deadline. We are working to get a quote for the site clearing. Director Gervasini stated there should be a fabric of land back clause in the contract. Director Savage suggested a clause be included in the permit that, if the project be delayed or cancelled, the Board would not be responsible to pay for or re-establish any clearing or grubbing performed on the site. The consensus of the Board was that if this were included, the General Manager could execute the temporary permit with BOP.

Staff also would like to proceed with the site clearing as soon as possible to be completed by March 31<sup>st</sup>, and negotiate with the tree trimming contractor we have already engaged at the South Plant. Upon motion from Director Savage, seconded by Director Norris, motion passed 4-0.

**RESOLVED (No. 15242),** that the Board authorize \$35,000 for tree removal on the tank site and pipeline easement.
